## School Timings Questionnaire

Thank you to all who completed the school timings questionnaire. The vast majority of parents are in favour of keeping the current timings ( $9 \mathrm{am}-3.30 \mathrm{pm}$ ). We will therefore continue with this arrangement for the rest of the year and this will be our official timings in September. Please can I take this point to remind you that this change in timings has not been taken lightly and that it is as a result of a new government requirement for all schools to offer a 32.5-hour week (including lunch/breaks).
We understand that there will be some individual families affected by this and we will try to communicate with these families to help transition to the new arrangements and accommodate any special circumstances they may have.
