Message from Mr Cooper

On behalf of everyone at Glaisdale, please can I thank you all for a wonderful year. Your support has allowed us to make leaps of progress as a school which has really benefitted our children in and out of the classroom. This is really reflected in the results we have achieved in national assessments, from early learning goals to phonics screening to Year 4 multiplication check to Year 2/6 SATs — we have achieved above the national average across the board!

We have a solid platform to build on this progress next year and we have plans in place to improve our school further through the following priorities:

- Further developing our curriculum in all subjects, basing our lessons around key themes
- Developing how we support children with additional needs
- Enhancing our writing curriculum
- Broadening children's experience of their community and wider world so that they are prepared for the next stage in their journey.

On a personal level, I would also like to extend my thanks for all your support during my own family's tricky time just after Christmas with the early arrival of my daughter, Phoebe. I am indebted to you for the care and understanding you gave during this time which allowed me to focus on my own family, as well as my Glaisdale Family! I am pleased to say that Phoebe continues to do well. Her consultant is very happy with her progress and the outlook is that she will not have any complications due to the premature birth. We are now starting to wean Phoebe onto food; she is starting to roll over on her own and is constantly talking to us or smiling!


