Expected impact and sustainability will be achieved

What impact/intended impact/sustainability are you expecting?

Confidence and knowledge in a variety of sports improved across the staff body.

More pupils meeting their daily physical activity goal, more pupils encouraged to take part in PE and Sport Activities. Younger children will have the opportunity to develop their physical literacy in structured activities at play time. Older children will have the opportunity to develop their communication and leadership skills in a practical activity. Play leaders will have 'training' throughout the year to develop their leadership.

Children have access to high quality equipment to further develop their physical literacy. This equipment is fit for purpose and also allows for an increase in confidence in staff knowing that the equipment is suitable.

More pupils will have the opportunity to attend free-of-charge extra-curricular clubs and wider curriculum experiences developing their physical literacy.

As per the national curriculum all children to access to swimming and crucial lifesaving skills.

All children will have access and chance to participate in high quality sporting competitions against other local schools.

All children will have the chance to represent the school.

All children will take part in a bespoke PE curriculum that is unique to Glaisdale and its surroundings.
